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Pesach for kids

As my children grow up, it has become increasingly important to educate them on the importance of Easter. The Easter for children is a time to eat delicious and symbolic food from a seder. However, there is a time when they have to learn the story behind the holiday. The tradition of Easter was born from the liberation of Jews from Egyptian slavery. It is considered as one of the most important Jewish holidays, we like the family company and friends at our table. While we eat and enjoy wine (or grape juice for children), we wait for Elia to visit us. Probably not what you might consider a typical seder here in North America, this video captures a snapshot of a seder Ethiopian family in Israel. Like most of us, the family makes sure that the house is tidy and has matzah ready to go before Easter begins. But how many of us burn the bread crumbs we find while we clean, and use a candle to control the crumbs under the bed? What about our matzah? (I want the recipe for this!) Despite the differences, everything else seems so familiar. The great family gathered around a table, reading the Haggadah, leaving a glass of wine for Elijah, hunting for the afikoman... This is a good way to introduce Easter to children and show the diversity of Jewish culture, including being a beginning of discussion for us in the diaspora. Thanks to Shalom Sesame for the video. It's spring! This means a lot of holy days in many different traditions of faith. Easter is probably the most widely observed holy day of spring in the Jewish tradition. It celebrates the story, told in the biblical book of Exodus, Jewish slaves fleeing Egypt. The "passing" part refers to G-d who guards the Israelite homes during the 10th plague when the angel of death killed the first-born children in Egyptian families. But Easter, known as Pesach in Hebrew, is a rich holiday, full of many interesting tidbits. And some of them are especially fun for children! Fun facts for children on Easter #1... The youngest child gets honors The script for Easter meal includes four questions. The four answers highlight why Easter night is so special for the Jewish people and why this particular meal is different from all others. The questions are usually answered by the younger child who is able. Pesach Matza by Marina Shemesh (publicdomainpictures.net) #2... Eat this, not that a ritual widely practiced during the seven or eight days of Easter abstains from "chametz", which means "exit". Chametz includes everything that is made with cereals that were combined with water and allowed to ferment/restrict. So... no cakes, cookies, pizza, pasta or beer. Jews eat matzah instead - unleavened bread that is really morea cracker. Observant Jews actually remove all the chametz from their homes during Easter. EasterCalled a seder, it's a ritual party the first night (or two) of the Easter holiday. The Seder plate includes six symbolic foods consumed at prescribed times while the history of Exodus is told. While some sections, like the four questions and eating symbolic foods, are part of the traditional Easter ritual, Jews are free to customize their Haggadah in many other ways. Some Haggadah focus on the problems of social justice of the modern day -like racism, such inequality and child labor. Other Haggadahsאֶרֶב have been handed down to your family for generations. And some include elaborate images. The largest Haggadah collections contain hundreds, even thousands of booklets, and many different versions can be purchased online. # אֶרֶב Passover at the White House President Barack Obama held the first Easter seder at the White House in 2009. He proceeded to host and participate in Selers during all his years as president. The larger piece is called AFIKoman אֶרֶב "a Greek word that means" Essert.אֶרֶב "AFIKOMEN is often wrapped and hidden. When the seder is complete, children run around to find it. The successful player receives a small reward, and the Matzah is shared with anyone still awake. To help pets celebrate Easter, different sell dog/cat food with Passover that does not contain Chametz (those grains not allowed). Corn is allowed during Easter, but it is not exceptional for your dog/cat, so some companies now share healthy lists and approved by Pasquas for pet observant owners. #אֶרֶב | Wine believing or not, the seder meal also includes drinking four glasses of wine. wine. The wine cups are common to every Saturday meal, but the other two cups are special for Easter. Usually, the fifth cup of wine is poured (and remains intact) in honor of Elia, the miraculous prophet who is not dead, but left the earth on a burning wagon, pulled by horses. In the most progressive Jewish communities, a cup of wine could also be paid for Ruth, the faithful moabite that has converted to Judaism. Ruth's Cup is a way to honor the diversity of the Jewish people. # אֶרֶב... waiting for the Easter of barley is not just a spring festival; It is actually a spring collection festival. The barley is the first grain to mature in the land of Israel, so Easter was celebrated at the same time the barley was offered to the Temple of Jerusalem. In ancient times, if the barley was not yet mature, or spring was not yet imminent, extra days would have been added to the calendar, and Easter would be held later.
